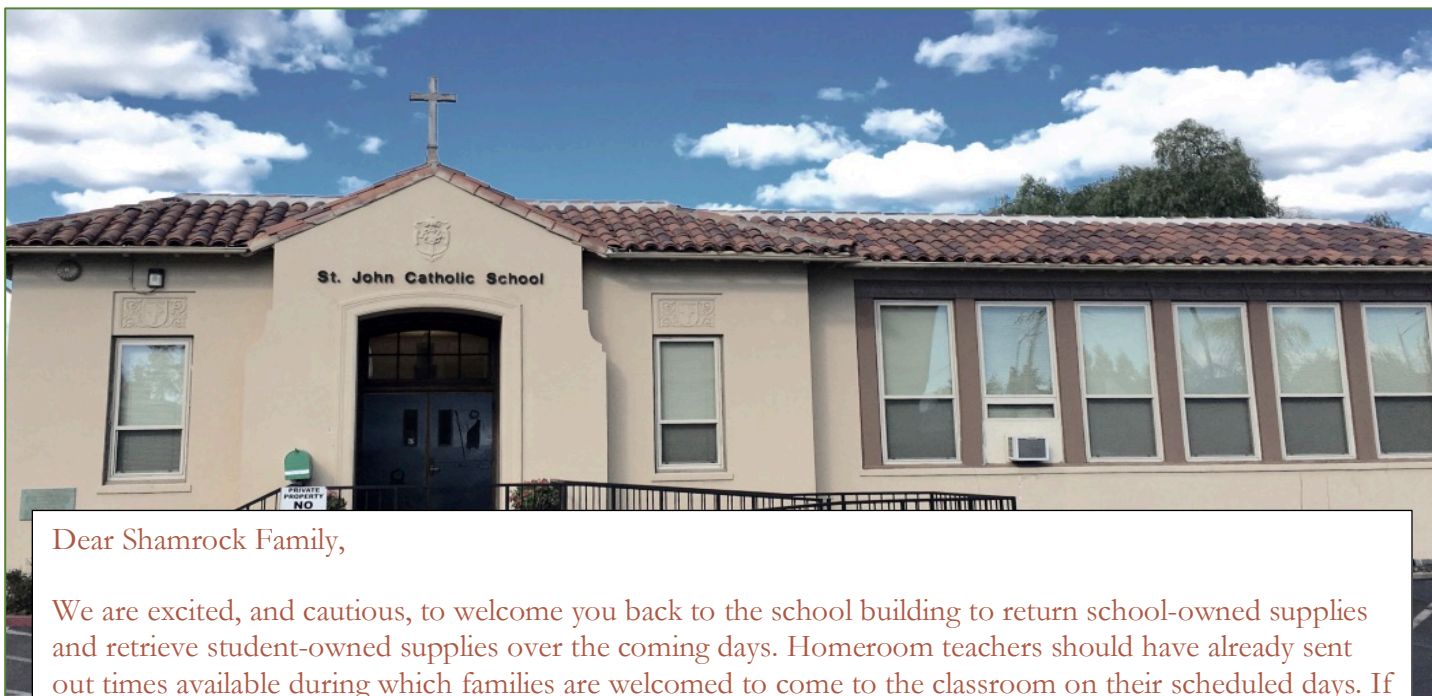

# St. John Catholic School

Dear Shamrock Family,

We are excited, and cautious, to welcome you back to the school building to return school-owned supplies and retrieve student-owned supplies over the coming days. Homeroom teachers should have already sent out times available during which families are welcomed to come to the classroom on their scheduled days. If this has yet to occur, please expect this from them soon. The list of class-specific days is indicated below.

- **8th grade:** May 29th (families enter through side junior high door)
- **7th & 3rd:** June 1st (7th grade families enter through side junior high door, 3rd through their recess exit/enter side door)
- **6th & 4th:** June 2nd (6th grade families enter through side junior high door, 4th through their recess exit/enter side door)
- **5th & TK:** June 3rd (5th grade families enter through their recess exit/enter side door, TK through their far exterior door)
- **2nd & 1st:** June 4th (2nd grade families enter through their recess exit/enter side door, 1st through their far exterior door)
- **K:** June 5th (K families enter through far exterior door)

It is absolutely critical that families come to school on their specified day, at their given time and through the indicated entry and exit points, so to ensure social distancing. All who enter the school building are to be wearing face coverings, and gloves are encouraged. Families will enter the school through the black gate, not the main front office lobby. External side doors will be marked through which families are to enter and exit. We ask that if you feel at all ill or have a fever or a cough, that you do not come to the school campus. I thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation with this matter, as our goal is to end our school year preserving the health and safety of our community. Lastly, if you have any school library books and/or you've collected money to donate to the CRS rice bowl program please bring them in on your pickup day.
