Dear Shamrock Family,

I continue to follow the local health trends, as it relates to Covid-19. While it is still **not** my plan to reopen for onsite learning when in the widespread, purple tier, as cases drop and ICU capacity becomes more available within our county and nearby areas, it seems practical

for me to revisit and reconsider the opportunity to offer onsite instruction once Alameda county resides steadily in the red tier. We are preparing for the safe return of students to campus.

We have taken steps to make our campus safer/more health conscious for all. Along with investing in and acquiring necessary PPE, we have also had refillable water bottle stations installed, in place of

inside drinking fountains (thanks to CYO for sponsoring this effort), as well as touchless faucets and paper towel dispensers installed in the bathrooms. Additionally, we have secured hand sanitizer stations for all school entrances/exits and hand washing stations to be used in addition to sinks in the bathrooms. These are just few examples of upgrades toward support of on campus health and safety.

I do plan to send another survey to parents in the coming week/s (once nearing or in the red tier), to learn of parent interest in having students attend school for in-person learning. From that data, more logistical planning will need to take place for us to determine how to best address the next phase of student learning. As we have throughout this entire process, your continued patience and support will be much appreciated. IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT TUITION ASSISTANCE:

Applications are now available for FACE (Family Aid – Catholic Education) and BASIC financial aid.

The BASIC Fund is available for new students whose families meet all the application requirements. The deadline to apply is March 31, 2021. Please also note, new siblings for current BASIC Fund students must request a link to apply for a new student. Like last year, BASIC renewals will be processed online.

FACE applications are available online only at https://online/factsmgt.com/signin/3FV YB or see the link on their website. This application requires documentation for income received in 2020. The deadline to apply is April 30, 2021.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION PLEASE READ: All families wishing to be considered for SJCS tuition assistance through the school must first apply for FACE before April 30, 2021. If you are currently receiving aid or wish to apply for the 2021-22 school year, you must first complete a FACTS application and apply for FACE before consideration for SJCS tuition assistance. If you have any questions regarding FACE, BASIC, or SJCS tuition assistance, please contact us. Deadlines established by FACE and BASIC are firm; a missed deadline will mean a missed opportunity.

ATTENTION SHAMROCK FAMILIES! - REQUIRED INTENT TO RETURN FORMS.
