Dear Shamrock Families,

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Where am I. Send me!"

During Lent we remember that all that we do, we do to remember and honor our Lord. It is important for us to model for our children how to give of ourselves to others, how to be meek and humble, how to sacrifice so that we may give to others a piece of the great gift Jesus has provided us. This week, let us reflect on how we can be Jesus to others who may be in need. Can we let them over while driving down a busy road, rather than just quickly passing them by? Counselor's Corner

Take Time to Help Your Child With Reading Comprehension

Long after children can sound out all the words on the page, they may still have problems understanding what they read.

Here are some steps you can follow to help your child read a story or an assignment in a textbook:

- 1. **Get Ready.** Before your child reads a word, take a few minutes to look through the story or the chapter. Ask some questions. "What do you think this reading will be about?" Have our child look at the pictures, if there are any. What ideas does your child have after looking at these pictures?
- 2. Scan the reading quickly. See if there are any words that may be hard to pronounce. Point out these words. Tell your child what they mean.
- 3. **Take a look** at the questions at the end of the story or chapter, if there are any. They will help guide your child's reading.
- 4. **Read the story or chapter.** Your child might read it silently, then later read it aloud to you. (Don't ask your child to read the text aloud until they have had a chance to read it silently first.)
- 5. Ask some questions about the reading. See if your child can tell you the main idea of what she read.
- 6. Ask your child to read the questions at the end of the selection aloud. Then have them restate each question in their own words.
- 7. Ask your child to answer a question. If they can't, pick out one or two key words in the question. Then look back through the reading to find the place in the text that includes those words. Have your child read that part aloud.



Oro Loma is excited to announce a new schools outreach project called "**In my own words...**" The project offers students the opportunity to be chosen for \$100 gift cards simply by telling us why they think recycling is important. "**In my own words...**" is broadly inclusive; all students are encouraged to submit their thoughts. Any submission that is in a student's own words, is on-topic and legible, and is no more than 100 words will be considered.

This new project continues a tradition of Oro Loma support for District students and schools that began in 1993 with the first Earth Day Poster Contest. **"In my own words…"** is a proud replacement of that poster contest.
