End of the 2019-2020 School Year Logistics

Student supplies in desks & lockers, etc.:

The school will offer days/time frames in late May/early June when parents can come to the school and return school-owned materials and collect student-owned supplies that remained at school from before our Shelter in Place order. We request parents to bring a bag/box in which to place student supplies to take home. One specific day & time frame will be established for classes to come to school in order to maintain social distancing, (please wear masks). Teachers will establish a schedule (times) during which parents are welcome to come to school to on the following days:

- 8th grade: May 29th (families enter through side junior high door)
- 7th & 3rd: June 1st (7th grade families enter through side junior high door, 3rd through their recess exit/enter side door)
- 6th & 4th: June 2nd (6th grade families enter through side junior high door, 4th through their recess exit/enter side door)
- 5th & TK: June 3rd (5th grade families enter through their recess exit/enter side door, TK through their far exterior door)
- 2nd & 1st: June 4th (2nd grade families enters through their recess exit/enter side door, 1st through their far exterior door)
- K: June 5th (K families enter through far exterior door)

Closing Out the Academic School Year - Sustained Learning Style:

• 8th Grade:

- 5/22 last day of instruction
- 5/26 will be the last day that each junior high teacher meets with 8th grade
- 5/27 will be the last class day for 8th grade: 8th grade meets with Ms. Pasion only (remain in "homeroom")
 - Student "Yearbook" messaging day- digital
- Report cards will be emailed to parents on 6/5
- Diploma retrieval- TBD
 - There are many 8th grade celebratory events that are being planned as well. ©

• TK-7th Grades:

- 6/4 last "class" day (day when teachers will meet virtually with students)
 - TK-7th grade teachers will NOT meet virtually with their class on the day they are at school for families to bring and retrieve supplies
- Live-streamed End of the Year Prayer Service in which we will honor students for Student of the Month (March & May), Altar Servers, SC members, etc. on 6/5 at 10am
 - This will be in place of meeting with classes on that final school day (6/5)
