Current first grade teacher, Ms. DeVost; current fourth grade teacher, Mrs. Able, and current middle school teacher, Mrs. Boerman will be leaving SJCS in June. They are each excitedly pursing a new path. We thank them for their incredibly loving and dedicated service and wish them much success in their future endeavors, whether it be a change in occupation or role or spending more time with family.

Our current third grade teacher, Ms. White, will be moving up with her 3rd grade class next year and will take on a new role as 4th grade teacher for the 2022 - 2023 school year. 


