Dear Shamrock Family,

I spent a restless night awake after returning home from a meeting late yesterday evening, only to learn of tragic events during a nightly newscast. It is hard to imagine the absolute horror, pain, and suffering that the Robb Elementary School community is facing right now given the loss of life and the trauma endured by every single person involved with this tragedy.

We understand that our community members may need to process this news emotionally and spiritually. We plan to offer time during morning and afternoon prayer to join in silence and offer intentions for the victims of Rob Elementary School shooting, as well as provide space for students to share their thoughts and feelings during class. I have asked that our teachers be prepared to help lead class discussions and engage with students and staff who struggle with this terrible news and who may need extra attention. I have also extended to offer them my own support as well.

We have strong safety measures in place to protect our community and ensure the safety of each student and staff member. We will continue to remind our students and staff about the importance of following our safety plans and protocols and continue to evaluate and strengthen those measures.

Such tragic events stir a broad range of feelings and emotions and we are committed to supporting our students and each other through this difficult

time. Our goals are to support each community member at St. John Catholic School and uplift the Robb Elementary School community members through prayer support. We remain dedicated to supporting our students and staff spiritually and emotionally and to ensuring the safety of our community as we complete the final days of the 2021/2022 school year in anticipation of summer break.




