Last week SJCS held our 4th annual Invention Convention at which students in grades 2-8 showcased their own personally created, working inventions. Aiming our focus on rigorous and relevant learning experiences, students partook in a 6-week long project that required them to identify a problem and establish a way to solve that problem through the creation of an invention. Utilizing grade level Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) as well as incorporating elements of technology and engineering, students designed invention blueprints, wrote scientific essays, created invention models, and produced posters to highlight the invention process.

We are proud to be a school that provides opportunities for our students to be real world problem solvers, inventors, creators, collaborators, designers, and presenters. Specifically we honor our 1st place Invention Convention winner, Travis Round for incorporating not only science, technology, and engineering standards in his creation, but we recognize him in a special way for his invention that also addressed a social justice issue and provided a solution to the very critical issue of homelessness in our Bay Area communities. Travis invented a mobile homeless shelter/tent, equipped with bedding. We are humbled by Travis' incredible oneness with his Catholic Identity and we recognize him for his authentic representation of Catholic Social Teachings.

It was an absolute treat to get to enjoy an evening together as a school family, raising money for SJCS, at our annual Margaritas and Must Haves Auction! IMPORTANT: Disaster Drill

Hello Parents,

The diocese mandates that all schools participate in a school-wide evacuation/student pickup drill every other school year to prepare for a large emergency during which we would have to evacuate the school and wait for student pick up. This very important drill provides staff with the opportunities to review and practice search and rescue and first aid protocols and allows guardians practice with emergency dismissal protocol. **This Friday**, on **May 25th**, our Disaster Drill will take place, beginning at noon. All students (**PreK-8**) will need to be picked up by either a parent or someone listed on their emergency information. <u>Students will</u> only be released to people who are indicated on their emergency list and people who pick up <u>students must have formal identification present and ready to provide staff upon release of</u> <u>students</u>. Lastly, their is no afternoon SEP this day, so ALL students will need to be picked up during the 12 o'clock hour, via our Disaster Drill dismissal system. There will be no re-entry to school or gym buildings once students are dismissed.

To Recap:

* Disaster Drill

* May 25, 2018

* 12:00pm

* Noon Dismissal of ALL students (PreK-8), NO SEP after school

* All guardians picking up students on this day must <u>PARK their cars, get OUT of their</u> <u>cars, and walk into the gym (trophy room side)</u> to have students released to them * There will be an organized standing line formed outside of the gym (posted signage will identify where parent/guardian line is to form and where guardians will wait for student release on this day

**There will be a 3-point pick up process on this day:

1st- Guardians will complete a student release form while waiting in line outside, indicating which students are requested for release. This form is given to the first student release station, in the trophy room. This is also where guardians will show proof of ID.

2nd- After showing ID, guardians will be directed to give approved student release form to Mrs. Catalan at the 2nd student release station, directly inside of the gym. Mrs. Catalan will call for the students being released via the microphone and then return the student release form back to the guardian. Guardians will step aside and WAIT for students to come to them (NOT guardians going to students)

3rd- Once all students have gathered with guardian, guardian and students walk over to Ms. Krisman at the final student release station by the side gym door, where she will check that the students being released match the students on the approved release form. Ms. Krisman will KEEP the student release form and then guardian/students are officially dismissed and may exit * Students will only be released to parents/guardians listed on student emergency information (parents are encouraged to update in writing prior to 5/24/18 if necessary) Changes to emergency cards will **NOT** be accommodated on 5/25.

* Students only released to parent/permitted guardian who comes with an ID for formal identification purposes

* Students will most likely all be dismissed by 12:45pm, so they may not need a lunch, just a morning snack on this day. With this said, if you are worried about your child getting hungry while they wait to be picked up, then you may send them with a sack lunch on this day. It would be best if students could **wait** to eat lunch until after they are dismissed, just to ensure for a quick and smooth dismissal process on this day.


