#### **STUDENT SUPPLY AND YEARBOOK PICK-UP:**

On Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup> and Thursday, August 13<sup>th</sup>, we will offer student supply/yearbook pick-up windows during which parents may come to the school campus to obtain supplies and technology necessary for distance learning. Tables, labeled by grade, will be set up in the playground area. We ask that all visitors enter through the black playground gate, wearing masks and gloves and practice social distancing. Families will need to bring with them a signed copy of the **Supply Liability Form** that will be provided to families by homeroom teachers, via email on Tuesday, August 11<sup>th</sup>. These forms are grade specific, indicating each of the school-issued supplies that will need to be returned in good, working condition at some point during the school year. Please look out for this **Supply Liability Form** from your child's homeroom teacher. If you are unable to bring this signed form to supply pick-up, we will arrange to have some available for signature upon pick-up. Should you be picking up student supplies for multiple families, you must come with a signed copy of the liability form on behalf of the families for whom you are picking up supplies. We advise that you carefully disinfect the outer layer of the technology device prior to use and that you wait 3 days to open any student supply packages and then disinfect supplies prior to use.

#### **PARENT ORIENTATIONS:**

On Wednesday, August 12th, teachers will be sending parents an email with a Parent Orientation. This communication may consist of a video, PowerPoint, or slide deck with information necessary for your family to be best prepared to begin school online, on August 17th. We ask that you please take the time to review orientation material as soon as possible, preferably before 6pm on Thursday, August 13th.

#### LIVE PARENT Q&A SESSIONS:

On Thursday, August 13th, teachers will offer time for parents to join in on a live, question and answer session, during which parents can ask clarifying questions pertaining to any of the parent orientation information that was provided the day prior. This is the time to gain clarity around any details pertaining to our distance learning start to the school year. The Live Q&A Parent Sessions on August 13th are as follows:

Parents will be provided with invitation links/access codes to each of the sessions and parents may choose which one they attend. Our aim in providing two sessions per class is to accommodate families with multiple SJCS students. Otherwise, as always, our teachers and staff are available to communicate with parents via email or virtual meeting platforms.
