REGISTRATION 2022

We have some great news to share regarding an upgrade in our registration process. Beginning in February, registration for the 2022-2023 school year will be done completely online. Not only will this streamline the registration process but it will also allow our administration team to more accurately obtain an enrollment count in order to more efficiently plan for and allocate recourses and staff for the upcoming school year. Registration for returning families will now be conducted between February 7th through February 28th. Emails will be sent out with individual links for families to complete the necessary forms and pay registration online. (More information about the specifics of this process will be coming in the next month.)

Registration for the 2022-2023 school year:

Registration is due between February 7th through February 28th. Registration payments made after February 28th will be assessed a \$50 re-enrollment fee.

As with any instance at St. John, if accommodations need to be made, we will try our best to provide them. Small changes like this upgrade to our registration process will not only assist with our planning for the 2022-2023 school year, but will help guide budgetary decisions in order to allow St. John Catholic School to be economically sustainable for years to come. We are grateful for your dedication and commitment to St. John Catholic School. We invite anyone who may know a family who may be interested in joining our shamrock family to welcome them to reach out to our school, as it is our aim to grow our school community!

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL FOR UNVACCINATED STUDENTS:

While there is no current California mandate on travel, there are recommendations regarding precautions for people who travel internationally and specifically for those who are not fully vaccinated. The CDC provides the guidance below which we are following in regards to students who return from international travel. I have highlighted the portion to which we paid special attention in regards to unvaccinated children.

After Arrival in the United States

You might have been exposed to COVID-19 on your travels. You might feel well and not have any symptoms, but you can still be infected and spread the virus to others. For this reason, CDC recommends the following:

All Travelers

RECOMMENDED

- Get tested with a COVID-19 <u>viral test</u> 3–5 days after travel.
 - o Find a <u>U.S. COVID-19 testing locationExternal Link</u> near you.
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms; isolate and get tested if you develop symptoms.
- Follow all state and local recommendations or requirements after travel.

If You are NOT Fully Vaccinated

RECOMMENDED

In addition to the testing recommendations above

- Stay home and self-quarantine for a full 7 days after travel, even if you test negative at 3–5 days.
- If you don't get tested, stay home and self-quarantine for 10 days after travel.

SJCS students who are **not** fully vaccinated (2 doses, and 2 weeks after 2nd dose) will need to be quarantined for 7 days and get tested within the 3-5 day window after return to the US, prior to being permitted to return to school for in-person learning. We ask that any parents of unvaccinated students who will be traveling internationally please alert Ms. Aimee (asire@csdo.org) of your trip dates and allow Ms. Aimee to confirm with you appropriate Covid-19 testing dates, as well as a return to school date. We thank you for your patience and understanding, as it is our obligation to take precautions during this time, especially in light of the new Omicron variant.

SHAMROCK SHOUTOUT:
