#### Handbook Reminder of the Week

Each week, look for a gentle reminder from our 2015-2016 Parent/Student Handbook. This week we will focus on **Academic Probation:** 

Students who earn below a C average on any report card will be placed on academic probation. Characteristics That Support Learning scores may be used as a mitigating factor to determine whether a student will be

placed on academic probation.

Academic probation means both the parent and student must attend a mandatory conference with the teacher at the discretion of administration, and a student success team conference may be required.

Students on academic probation will also lose the privilege to participate in extracurricular activities, including choir, student council, liturgy committee, etc. A student on academic probation for two consecutive trimesters during the same school year may not be eligible for enrollment the following academic year. Status of students on academic probation will be reviewed at progress report and end-of-trimester report card periods, and the final determination will be made by the Principal and/or Pastor in consultation with the teacher(s) and the diocesan Schools Department as needed.

#### **NEW! Student Emergency Kits**

St. John Catholic School recently completed an inventory of emergency supplies. We have a good stock of medical supplies and emergency blankets, but need to ensure emergency food and water packs for each child. Schools customarily ask families to provide an emergency pack for each child at the beginning of the school year, and then the packs are sent home at the end of each school year to be restocked with non-expired products.

Beginning in January 2016, families will be asked to provide an emergency pack for their child(ren). Required supplies will include two 16oz. bottles of water, six high protein bars or one 2400 calorie Datrix food ration bar, and one pair of underwear. All consumable items should not expire before June 2016.

More information regarding these kits will be sent home the first week in January. Your child's safety and comfort are our first priority, and your cooperation is much appreciated.

#### **San Francisco Boys Choir Auditions**

Auditions for the San Francisco Boys Chorus will take place at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland on Saturday, January 9, 2016. Boys 5-12 years old with unchanged voices are encouraged to apply, and no prior music training is necessary.

Boys will receive vocal training and gain self-confidence, self-discipline, and appreciation for music. Boys who were trained by the San Francisco Boys Chorus have performed in San Francisco Opera productions since 1948, in addition to touring domestically and internationally.
